

## **EU-funded international training program on combat against cybercrime**

The Office of the Prosecutor General of Hungary hosted a five-day-long training session attended by participants of the Prosecution Service of Hungary and of Polish, German, Lithuanian, Bulgarian law enforcement authorities on 26th-30th November 2018. The training session was organized within the framework of a 24-month-long EU-funded project on combat against cybercrime applied for in the Erasmus+ program. During the training session experts from the National Tax and Customs Administration of Hungary and from the Hungarian National Bureau of Investigation gave presentations on the new challenges of the combat against cybercrime and current issues of law enforcement and prosecutorial practices relating to digital evidence. The training event also gave an opportunity for the participants from different countries to discuss cybercrime issues in workshops and to strengthen cooperation in the fight against cybercrime by exchanging their experiences and good practices. The training session fully complied with project specifications, and it ended with a valuable result.
