

## **ERASMUS+ PROJECT TRAINING TO COMBAT CYBERCRIME**

On 21<sup>st</sup> October 2019 the Office of the Prosecutor General of Hungary held a training for prosecutors and IT staff members of the Hungarian Cybercrime Network of Prosecutors. The training was organized within the framework of its Erasmus+ project titled “Professional training of law enforcement services to combat cybercrime”, a project coordinated by the Regional Police Headquarters in Łódź, Poland and implemented in a Polish-German-Lithuanian-Bulgarian-Hungarian strategic partnership. The one-day-long training aimed at disseminating the final report drawn up as a result of the project and was attended by 44 prosecutors and IT specialists working for the Prosecution Service of Hungary. In his speech delivered at the beginning of the event prosecutor Dr. Barna Miskolczi, Chief of Cabinet and Head of the Department for International and European Affairs in the Office of the Prosecutor General of Hungary welcomed prosecutor and IT staff member participants of the training, and afterwards prosecutor dr. Melinda Losonczy-Molnár, Head of Unit at the Chief Prosecution Office of the Capital, Budapest outlined the major topics of the final report. During the training the 3 prosecutors and 3 IT staff members, who had been involved in the project as participants, held presentations on various aspects and current issues of cybercrime and the fight against cybercrime. The presentations also included case studies.

The final report based on experiences of law enforcement authorities of several countries and assembled by policemen, IT staff members and prosecutors as a result of the 24-month-long project provides useful knowledge to judicial professionals.
